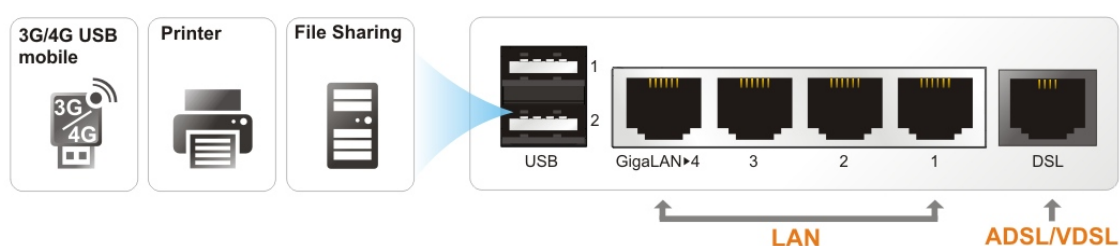
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1. Introduction

Through the central management for multiple access points, Vigor router can set wireless profile in advance and apply to the access point managed easily and conveniently.

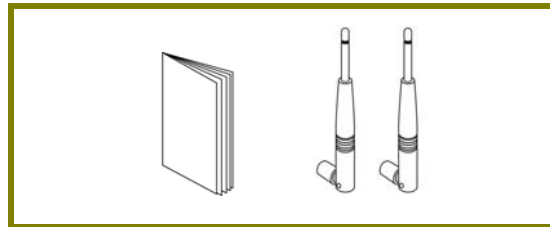
In addition, Vigor2762 series supports two USB interfaces for connecting USB printer to share the printer or USB storage device for sharing files and 3G/4G backup services.

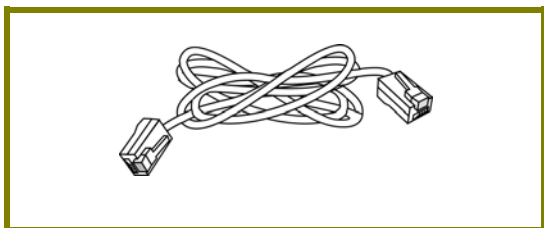

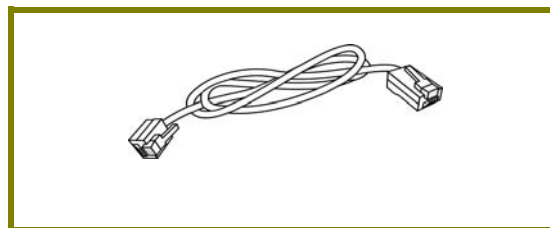
Vigor router



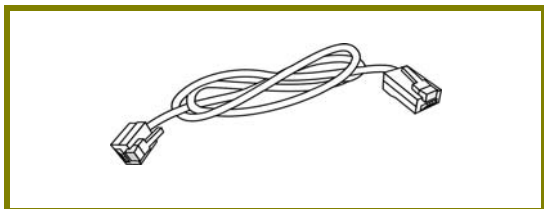
Quick Start Guide, Antenna (for “n” or “ac” model)



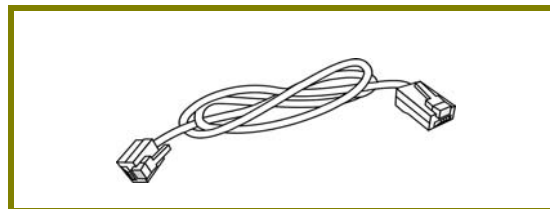
RJ-45 Cable (Ethernet)



RJ-11 to RJ-11 Cable (Annex A)

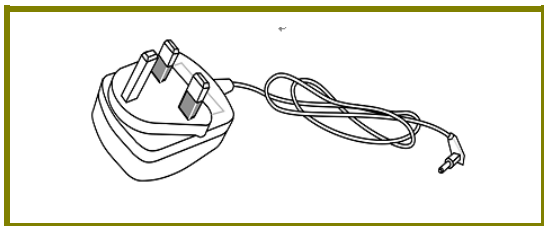


RJ-11 to RJ-45 Cable (Annex B)

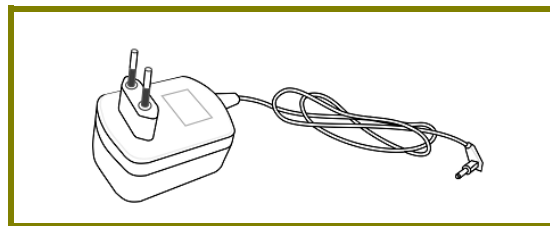

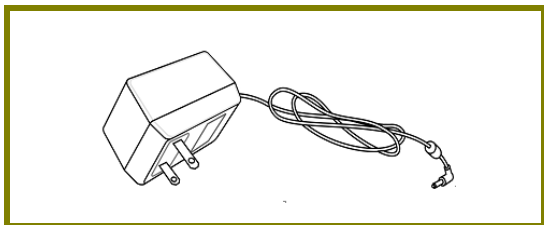

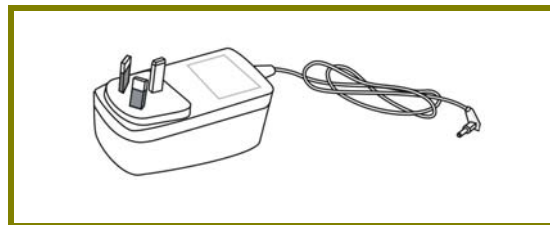
UK-type Power Adapter

USA/Taiwan-type Power Adapter

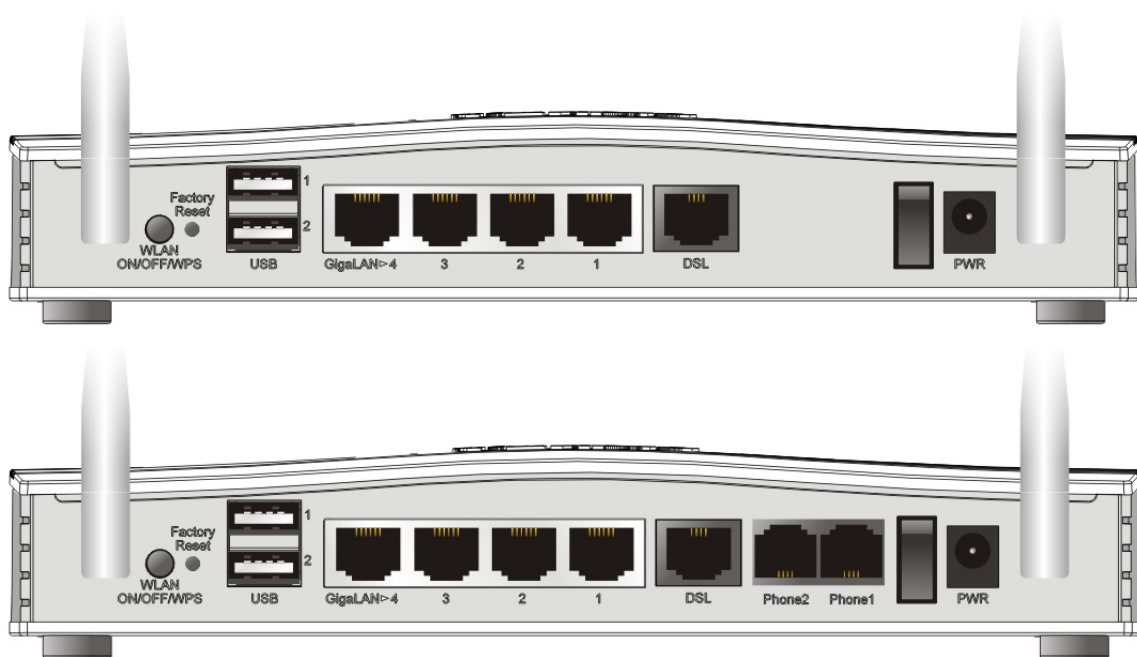


AU/NZ-type Power Adapter

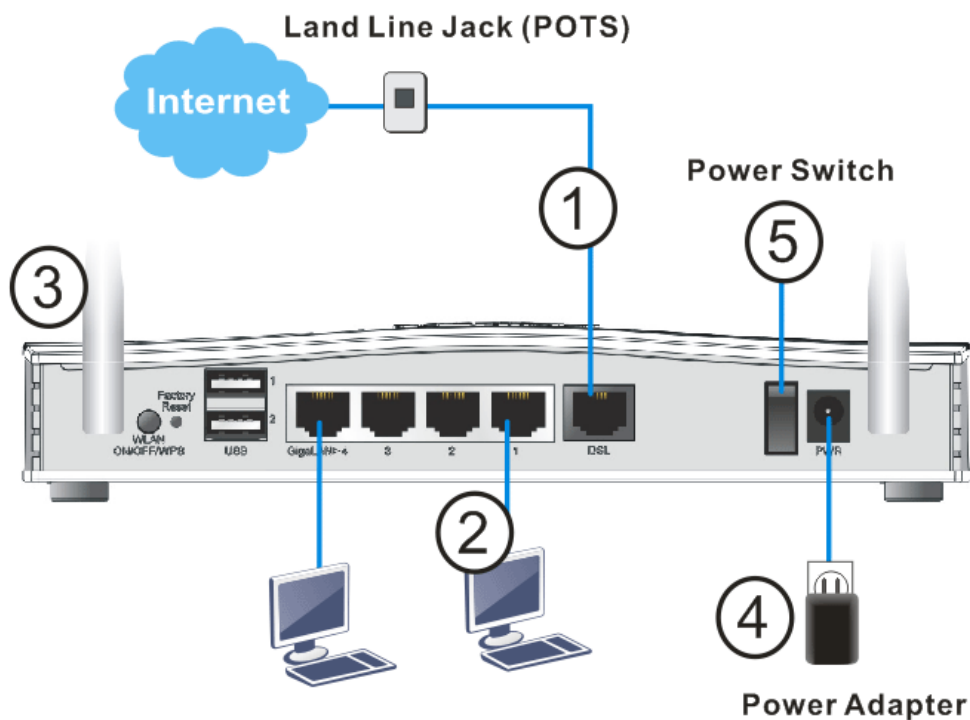
4. Hardware Installation

This section will guide you to install the router through hardware connection and configure the router's settings through web browser.

Before starting to configure the router, you have to connect your devices correctly.

4.1 Network Connection

1. Connect the DSL interface to the land line jack with a DSL line cable.
2. Connect one port of 4-port switch to your computer with a RJ-45 cable. This device allows you to connect 4 PCs directly.
3. Connect detachable antennas to the router.
4. Connect one end of the power cord to the power port of this device. Connect the other end to the wall outlet of electricity.
5. Power on the router.
6. Check the ACT and DSL, LAN LEDs to assure network connection.

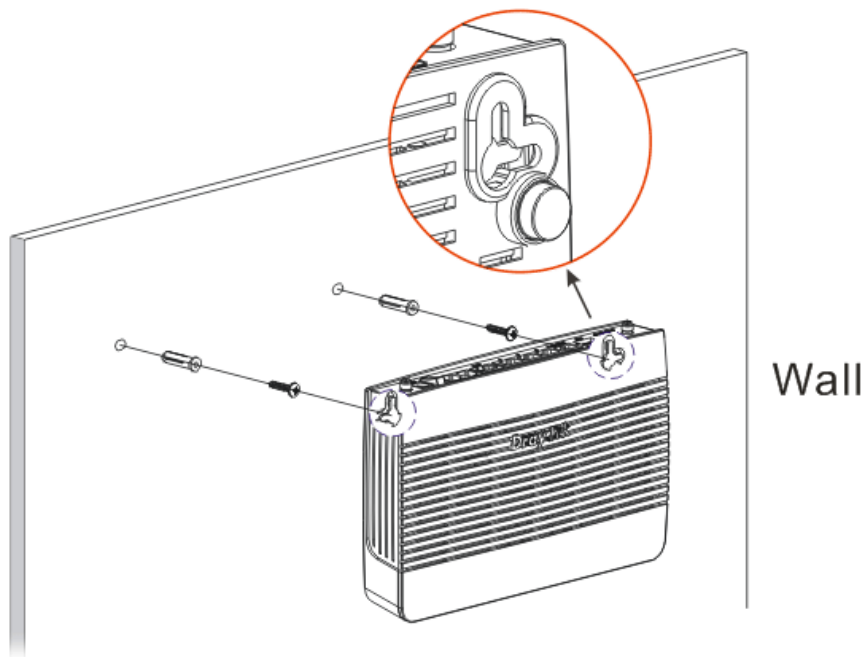
Note

Remove the protective film from the router before use to ensure ventilation.

4.2 Wall-Mounted Installation

Vigor2762 wireless series has keyhole type mounting slots on the underside.

1. A template is provided on the Vigor2762 packaging box to enable you to space the screws correctly on the wall.
2. Place the template on the wall and drill the holes according to the recommended instruction.
3. Fit screws into the wall using the appropriate type of wall plug.



Note

The recommended drill diameter shall be 6.5mm (1/4").

4. When you finished about procedure, the router has been mounted on the wall firmly.

5. Software Configuration

To access Internet, please finish basic configuration after completing the hardware installation.

5.1 Check the DSL Link State

1. Connect the DSL line to Vigor Router and wait for a moment.
2. Login Vigor router WUI.
3. Check if Vigor router can get "SHOWTIME" with the DSL line via Online Status page.

If Vigor Router can get SHOWTIME with the DSL line, then you could go to 5.2 Quick Start Wizard for setting up the Internet Access settings.

5.2 Quick Start Wizard

Make sure your PC connects to the router correctly.

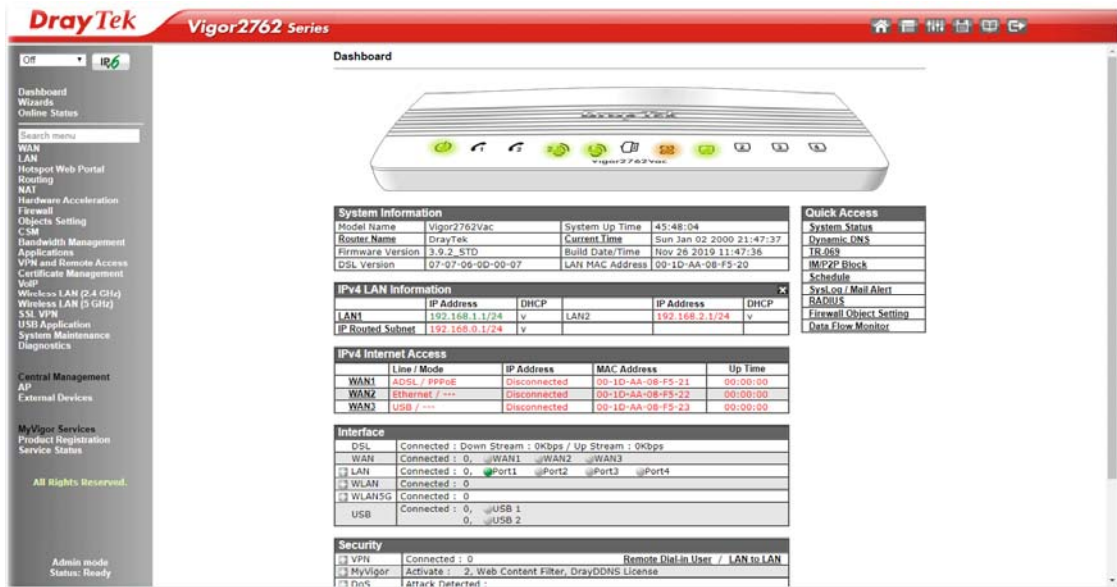
Open a web browser on your PC and type <http://192.168.1.1>. A pop-up window will open to ask for username and password. Please type "admin/admin" as the Username/Password and click **Login**.



Note

You may either simply set up your computer to get IP dynamically from the router or set up the IP address of the computer to be the same subnet as the default IP address of Vigor router 192.168.1.1.

Now, the Main Screen will pop up. Click Wizards>>Quick Start Wizard.
